#### **Barn Restoration**

The owners of this barn were told that the building needed to be torn down (Fig. 1).

This barn was jacked and leveled, and a new timber frame undercarriage was cut and installed (*Fig. 2*). It is now sitting squarely on the original foundation. Later, the floor joists were installed, and two layers of hemlock flooring were laid.

#### **Timber Frame Construction**

We also build new timber frame structures. These include barns, additions to historic barns, shops, and carriage sheds. These can be built on original foundation sites. Some farmsteads have lost one of their buildings and an authentic replacement is needed.
